Job Description

Reporting to the Head of Education, the Summer Art Camp Instructor prepares and delivers a wide range of visual art-based activities to children and youth ages 6 to 12 in Oakville Galleries' summer art camps. The Summer Art Camp Instructor is working on-site at Oakville Galleries' Gairloch Gardens (1306 Lakeshore Road East), Monday to Friday (except holidays) from 8:30 am to 4:30 pm daily. They are a key member of the education team and serve as ambassadors of Oakville Galleries through their regular contact with members of the public.

General Responsibilities

- Contribute to summer camp preparation, including lesson preparation, coordinating supplies and equipment, and piloting program activities;
- Design, plan and lead children ages 6 to 12 in hands-on art lessons;
- Communicate with staff, parents, and children to ensure the safety, security, and efficiency of the camp;
- Maintain a safe and clean environment for camp participants;
- Assist with daily opening and closing procedures and post-camp clean-up;
- Evaluate and revise program activities and lessons on an ongoing basis and upon program conclusion.

Qualifications

The ideal candidate:

- Is currently pursuing a post-secondary degree in Art History, Education, Visual and/or Media Arts, Museum Studies, or a similar field;
- Has previous experience working with or supervising children;
- Possesses a strong understanding of and genuine interest in contemporary visual art;

- Is knowledgeable about a wide array of artistic techniques, practices, and materials;
- Demonstrates excellent organizational, planning, responsibility, and leadership abilities;
- Can work independently and take initiative within a team setting;
- Exhibits excellent interpersonal and communication skills;
- Is able to provide, or is willing to obtain, a Criminal Background Check and/or Vulnerable Sector Screening;
- Has working proficiency in English (both written and oral). Additional language skills, particularly bilingual proficiency in French (English-French, with emphasis on oral skills), are an asset.
- Standard First Aid + CPR C certification or willingness to obtain is considered an asset.

The Summer Art Camp Instructor position is dependent on funding from the Canadian Heritage Young Canada Works program (YCW). Candidates for the position must:

- Be legally entitled to work in Canada;
- Be a Canadian citizen or a permanent resident, or have refugee status in Canada (unfortunately, non-- Canadian students holding temporary work visas or awaiting permanent status are not eligible);
- Be between 16 and 30 years of age at the start of employment;
- Intend to return to full-time studies in the fall of 2027.
